ASHS South Australian Management Council Awards (SAMCA)

The South Australian Management Council Awards are a scheme designed to recognise consistent, meritorious and versatile performances by Australian Stock Horses and ASHS Members in Australian competitions, .

Certificates and Trophies are awarded at two levels for each of the 6 sections over a period of 12 months (July through to June) – that is, a **Merit Award** and a **Champion Award**. A further **Supreme Versatility Trophy** will be awarded for horses that achieve Champion Status in 3 of the 6 sections.

Eligibility for Nomination

- 1. Stud Book, Second Cross, Special Merit and First Cross horses may attain points from the date of registration as Australian Stock Horses.
- 2. Breeding Purposes Only horses will not be eligible to be nominated for SAMCA.
- 3. Horses other than registered Australian Stock Horses being ridden by children under 13 years of age are eligible for Nomination and can be ridden in Branch Events*
- 4. Minimum Age Restrictions:
 - a. Led Classes 4yrs & over (3yrs & Under separate young horse category)
 - b. Ridden Classes (excluding Classes listed in part c) 2 Years
 - c. Dressage, Eventing & Showjumping 3 Years

Acceptance of nominations is subject to:

- Horse owner must be a Financial Member of the Society
- Rider must be a Full Member, Youth Member or Youth Participant Member
- Payment of the specified nomination fee
- Approval by SA ASHS Management Council

Record Keeping

- 1. Once the nomination has been accepted the owner/rider of the horse will be forwarded a point score booklet in which results are to be recorded.
- 2. In the instance of a horse attaining equal or divided placing in an event, the points pertaining to the highest place will be awarded. Both horses gain the same points.

Scoring Rules

- 1. Points gained prior to the horse being nominated are not valid.
- 2. Details of the show and each event where points are gained must be entered in the Point Score Booklet.
- 3. Points can only be attained in classified events open to any breed or restricted to ASH only.
- 4. Points may only be claimed if a ribbon or prize is awarded.
- 5. Points will be awarded in accordance with the Point Score Table and Rules for each section.
- 6. The Point Score Booklet must be returned to the SAMC before the nominated date marked on the booklet. When sending the Point Score Booklet to the SAMC, please keep a copy for your records.
